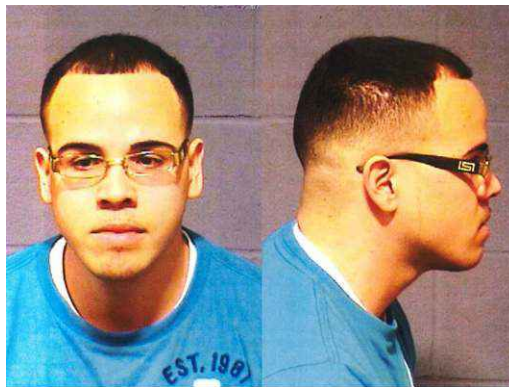

HARTFORD SHOOTING TASK FORCE INVESTIGATION LEADS TO ARREST

(Hartford, CT.) ▣ An investigation by the Hartford Shooting Task Force (HSTF) into a March 12, 2013, shots fired incident has led to the arrest of a Franklin Avenue man.

On April 2, 2013, Daniel Roman, 24, of 218 Franklin Avenue, was taken into custody without incident by HSTF Detectives Cournoyer and Sarju following the issuance of a Hartford Superior Court warrant charging him with the March 12, 2013, shots fired incident. Roman remains in custody on \$500,000 bond. He has been charged with criminal possession of a firearm, first degree assault, unlawful discharge of a firearm, carrying a pistol without a permit, reckless endangerment and breach of peace.

On July 5, 2011, Mayor Segarra, joined by Chief State's Attorney Kane, State's Attorney Hardy, then Chief Inspector James C. Rovella, and others, launched the Shooting Task Force, a collaboration of local, state and federal law enforcement agencies dedicated to eradicating gun violence in Connecticut's Capital City. A partnership between the Hartford Police Department, Office of the Hartford State's Attorney, Office of the Chief State's Attorney, the Connecticut State Police, the Connecticut Departments of Correction and Parole, and the West Hartford, Manchester, Wethersfield and East Hartford police departments, the Hartford Shooting Task Force is charged with investigating gun violence and bringing those responsible for such violence to prosecution. It also collaborates with the Violent Crimes Bureau and the Witness Protection Unit in the Office of the Chief State's Attorney and in conjunction with the Central Connecticut Cold Case Task Force. During the first year of its operation, from July 5, 2012 through June 30, 2012, the City of Hartford has seen a 31.48% reduction in shooting victims.
