NON-FINANCIAL RESOLUTION DEMS #1

RESOLVED, That the Administration along with the Chief of the Hartford Fire Department research the feasibility and present to the Council a cost-benefit analysis regarding the city providing 911 emergency ambulance services and pre-hospital assistance services and; be it further

RESOLVED, That the Administration along with Hartford Fire Chief will submit this plan to the Court of Common Council, no later than August 1, 2016.

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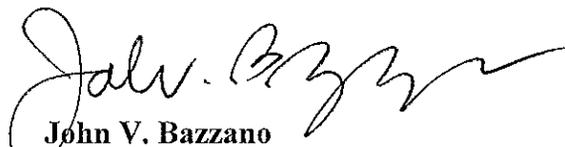
NON-FINANCIAL RESOLUTION DEMS #2

RESOLVED, That the Court of Common Council will convene a Sub- Committee of the Operations, Managements, Budget and Government Accountability Committee that will work with the Administration on achieving cost savings by, but not limited to, consolidations, regional cost-sharing, upgrades in technology and systematically cultivating a culture where the employees of the City of Hartford are engaged as part of the solution to ensure long-term reoccurring savings; and be it further

RESOLVED, That as part of this Sub-Committee the Board of Education and the administration work to develop a plan for consolidations with the City of Hartford as well as internal consolidations within the Board of Education, that would achieve a minimum of \$20,000,000 long-term reoccurring savings; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Sub-Committee shall convene no later than July 1, 2016 and membership of said Sub-Committee will be determined by the Operations, Management, Budget and Government Accountability Committee.

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This is to certify that at a meeting of the Court of Common Council, May 18, 2016, the following RESOLUTION was passed.

NON-FINANCIAL RESOLUTION DEMS #3

WHEREAS, The Court of Common Council is tasked with representing the will of the people of Hartford; and

WHEREAS, Approximately 25% of Board of Education live in Hartford; and

WHEREAS, Approximately 33% of City employees live in Hartford; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That as part of the work of the LiveHartford Taskforce they look into potential Federal and State programs and national best practices that would provide targeted incentives for Hartford teachers, firefighters, and police to live in the City of Hartford.

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NON-FINANCIAL RESOLUTION DEMS #4

WHEREAS, According to the Connecticut Department of Labor, the City of Hartford has an unemployment rate of 10.4%; and

WHEREAS, We know that number to be much larger in certain neighborhoods throughout the City of Hartford; and

WHEREAS, As of April 2nd, 2016, of the 537 full-time employees in the Hartford Police Department (including school crossing guards) only 116 are Hartford residents (21.6%); and

WHEREAS, Of the 16 new hires (13 full-time and 3 part-time) in the Police department going back to January 3, 2016, only 3 are Hartford residents and they are all part-time; and

WHEREAS, The Court of Common Council is tasked with serving as the legislative body of the City of Hartford, representing the will of the people; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Court of Common Council urges the Administration, the Chief of the Hartford Police Department, in consultation with the Human Resources Department, to have at least 50% of the incoming Hartford Police class of recruits be Hartford residents.

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NON-FINANCIAL RESOLUTION DEMS #5

RESOLVED, That the Administration along with the Director of Public Works provide a report regarding the city's use of energy performance contracting as a cost saving measure on energy associated expenses; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Administration along with the Director of Public Works research the feasibility and cost-benefit analysis of hiring a part-time energy manager for the City of Hartford as a means to achieve energy savings.

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NON-FINANCIAL RESOLUTION DEMS #6

RESOLVED, That the Internal Audit Department, in conjunction with the Internal Audit Commission, begin an audit of the City's current take-home car policy; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the audit report include a recommendation from the Internal Audit Department and Commission as to what changes the City can make for cost-savings, including consideration of ride-sharing technology.

RESOLVED, That the largest non-profit organizations should include colleges, universities, hospitals, and any other organization in the City of Hartford that is deemed as a non-profit; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the membership of said taskforce will be composed by July 1st.

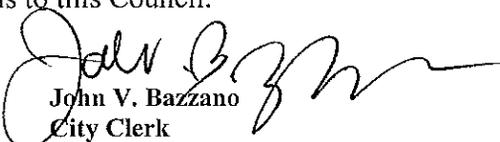

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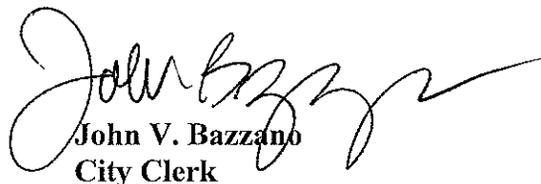

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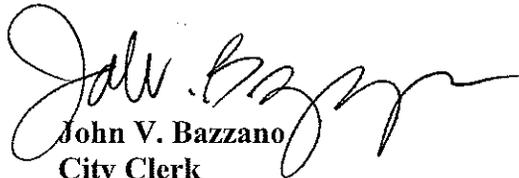
