This is to certify that at a meeting of the Court of Common Council, October 24, 2011, the following RESOLUTION was passed.

Whereas, Virulent infectious diseases such as measles, pertussis, diphtheria, polio, hepatitis and meningitis, which previously caused death or disability in scores of children, are largely avoidable through vaccination, and

Whereas, The Centers for Disease Control provide recommended immunization schedules and funding to the states for the purpose of increasing immunization rates, and

Whereas, The Connecticut Department of Public Health (CT DPH) is committed to appropriate immunization of children by age two (2) and provides CDC grant funding to eleven areas in Connecticut through its Immunization Action Plan (IAP) program, and

Whereas, In the thirteen years since the CT DPH began providing IAP funds to Hartford, the immunization rate for Hartford children from birth to two years has increased from 59% to 80%, and

Whereas, The Connecticut Department of Public Health has advised the City that it will make available to the City approximately \$117,710 in IAP grant funds for the period of January 1 through December 31, 2012, and

Whereas, The Hartford Department of Health & Human Services will coordinate and provide immunization services through the grant, including education, referral, and tracking, and the Hispanic Health Council will provide outreach services, now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Mayor and Court of Common Council do hereby authorize the City to accept \$117,710 in IAP grant funds from the CT Department of Public Health, and be it further

Resolved, That the Mayor is authorized to execute any and all manner of other documents and to take such other actions as he and the Corporation Counsel may deem


appropriate and in the best interests of the City in order to receive, contract and expend the above referenced grant funds, and be it further

Whereas, The Capitol Region Council of Governments (CRCOG) will manage these funds through its Emergency Planning Committee in accordance with the region's emergency response plan, and

Whereas, SHSGP funds may be used for purchase of equipment, employee and volunteer training, citizen preparedness plans, and other emergency management activities, now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the CT Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection (formerly the Department of Emergency Management and Homeland Security) and the Capitol Region Council of Governments which governs the allocation and management of State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSGP) funds in the Capitol Region, and be it further

Resolved, That said MOA authorizes the CT Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection (formerly the Department of Emergency Management and Homeland Security)

to act as the agent of the City of Hartford with regard to the SHSGP funds and to retain and administer grant funds for state- and region-wide programs, and be it further

Resolved, That the MOA also authorizes the Capitol Region Council of Governments to provide financial and programmatic oversight of SHSGP funds, and be it further

Resolved, That the Mayor is authorized to execute any and all manner of other documents and to take such other actions as he and the Corporation Counsel may deem appropriate and in the best interests of the City in connection with the MOA, and be it further

Resolved, That no person or entity shall be entitled to rely on, or otherwise claim any benefit by reason of this resolution should the Mayor fail to execute the aforementioned agreement or other documents, or to take any of the aforesaid actions, and be it further

Whereas, The Hartford Fire Department has developed a program to purchase 2,124 ten-year sealed Lithium battery powered smoke detectors and install these detectors in homes in the city, and

Whereas, The cost of the program is \$103,264 and the City has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$82,612 by FEMA, and

Whereas, FEMA requires, as a condition of the grant, that the City of Hartford share in the cost of the program and provide a cash match equal to 20% of the total cost of the program, or \$20,652, now, therefore be it

Resolved, That the Mayor is hereby authorized to accept the grant of \$82,612 from the Federal Emergency Management Agency through its Assistance to Firefighters Fire Prevention and Safety Grant program for the purchase and installation of ten-year sealed lithium battery powered smoke detectors, and be it further

Resolved, That the Mayor is authorized to execute any and all manner of other documents and to take such other actions as he and the Corporation Counsel may deem appropriate and in the best interests of the City in order to receive, contract and expend the above referenced grant funds, and be it further

Whereas, It is part of the City's anti-blight And beautification program that may become a role model for other cities to follow; and


Whereas, On each trash drum there will be a decal listing the city project and all the students who painted the drum to give them recognition for their contribution and help elevate their self-esteem; and






