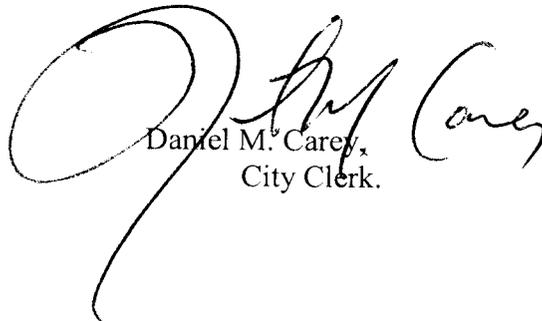
RESOLVED, That the street will be open by closure time, and be it further

WHEREAS, The Department of Public Works has been successful in obtaining commitments of Federal funds for the Parkville Urban Design and Transportation Improvement Project which will involve the reconstruction of Park Street from Prospect Avenue to Sisson Avenue; and

WHEREAS, The project will consist of pedestrian safety enhancements, new decorative sidewalks, ornamental lighting, street trees, new pavement, and other amenities; and

WHEREAS, The City of Hartford will use Federal funds that will be administered through the State of Connecticut Department of Transportation to supplement City of Hartford funds committed to the project; and

WHEREAS, The Federal funds noted above will provide 80 percent of the \$1,500,000 in "participating" costs provided for in the grant, with the City providing the balance of approximately \$2.9 Million of the total project costs which are currently estimated to be \$4.1 Million; and

WHEREAS, The City of Hartford must enter into a formal agreement with the State of Connecticut as a condition of the grant; and

WHEREAS, The City will be responsible for the bidding, contract administration, construction inspection, and coordination of the project; and

WHEREAS, The City will be reimbursed for a portion of its time and expenses incurred to perform inspection and administration for the project as a part of the formal agreement; and

WHEREAS, The City must commit in the formal agreement to provide long term maintenance, repair, and operation of the completed project; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That Eddie A. Perez, Mayor, be, and hereby is authorized to sign the agreement entitled "Agreement between the State of Connecticut and the City of Hartford for the Construction, Inspection, and Maintenance of the Parkville Urban Design and Transportation Improvements Project, Utilizing Federal Funds Under the Enhancement Component of the Surface Transportation Program, State Project No. 63-632, Federal Aid Project No. TEA-PEDS (086)"; and be it further

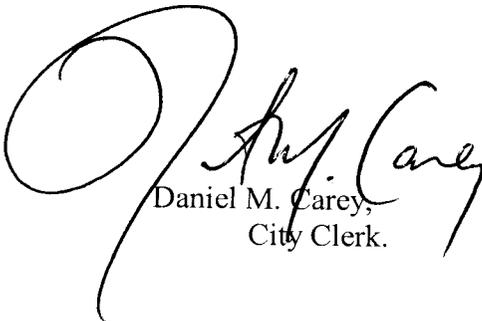

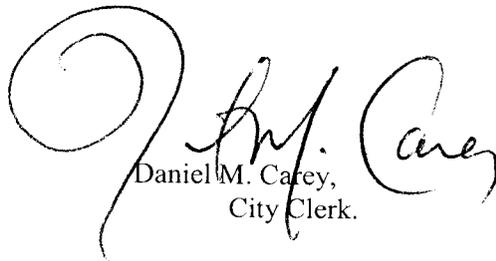

WHEREAS, The team will raise approximately half of the funds needed to cover expenses but still require \$10,000 to cover travel, food and competition fees; now, therefore, be it

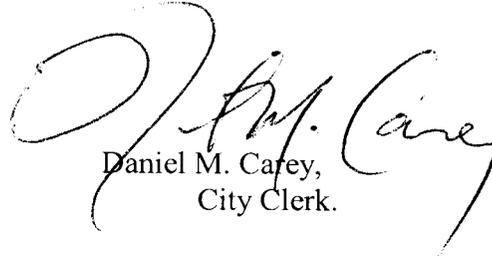
