**Whereas,** To implement the "Access to Food Program", the City currently contracts with New Testament Church of God, Community Renewal Team, Inc., Bethel Mission AME Church, and the Village for Families & Children Inc. all of which operate food pantries and provide needs assessment, information, and referral services to Hartford residents in need, and

**Whereas,** The City desires to execute new contracts with the four service providers for a contract period of July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012, in the amount of \$13,500 each, with the option to extend the contracts for three one-year periods, and

**Whereas,** The funds needed to cover the costs of this program are included in the budget of the Health & Human Services Department in the FY 2011-2012 Adopted General Fund Budget, now, therefore, be it

**Resolved,** That the Court of Common of Common Council hereby authorizes the Mayor to execute contractual agreements with New Testament Church of God, Community Renewal Team, Inc., Bethel Mission AME Church, and the Village for Families & Children Inc., for an initial contract term of July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012 in an initial amount of \$13,500 each, and be it further

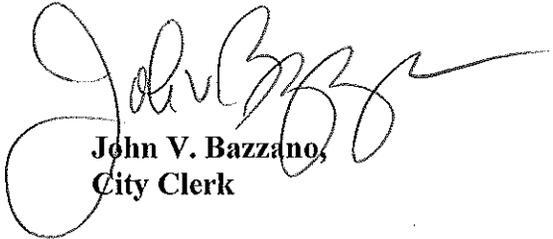
**Resolved,** That the contracts may be extended for three (3) additional one-year periods upon mutual written consent and subject to the availability of funds, and be it further

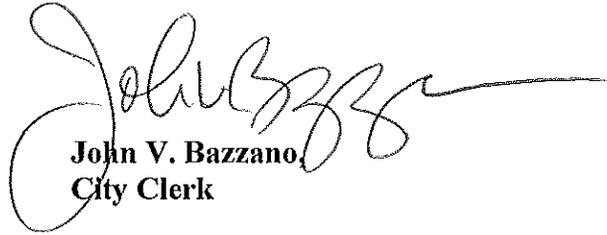

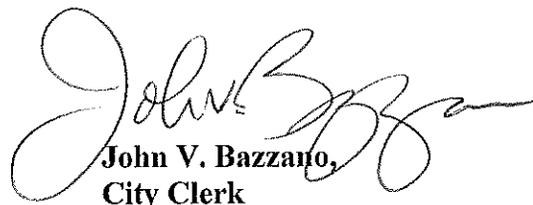

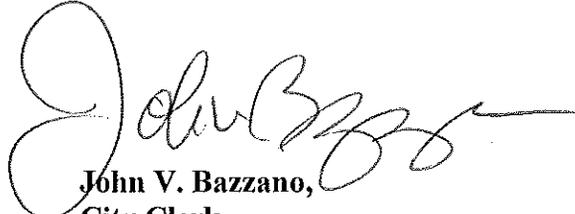

**Whereas,** The City of Hartford ("City") has twenty-three (23) surplus vehicles and trucks stored at the vehicle maintenance yard operated by the City's Department of Public Works ("DPW") and located at 40 Jennings Road (the "Yard"); and

**Whereas,** DPW solicited nine (9) automobile salvage dealers to provide quotes for these vehicles and trucks, five (5) of which dealers came to the Yard to examine such stock before submitting their proposals; and

**Whereas,** In response to such solicitation, Corona's Auto Parts, Inc., Stanley E. Jablonski, Jr. d/b/a Leveille's Auto Recyclers, R&R Industries, Inc., Central Towing and Transportation, LLC and LKQ Corporation (individually, a "Vendor," and collectively, the "Vendors") submitted proposals to acquire the twenty-three (23) vehicles (including some trucks, a bus and a fire safety house) set forth on Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof (individually, a "Vehicle," and collectively, the "Vehicles"); and

**Whereas,** In order to realize the highest rate of return for the sales of the Vehicles, DPW has awarded the sale of each Vehicle to the Vendor providing the highest quote for such Vehicle, thereby resulting in total revenue to the City for these sales in the amount of \$32,132.89; and

**Whereas,** DPW has determined that the revenue that the City could realize through the sales of the Vehicles for scrap metal would be approximately \$16,000.00; and

**Whereas,** Pursuant to §2-641 of the Hartford Municipal Code, the City's Purchasing Agent (the "Purchasing Agent") is authorized to sell the Vehicles to the Vendors, subject to approval by the City's Court of Common Council; now therefore be it

**Resolved,** That the sale of the each Vehicle by the Purchasing Agent to the respective Vendor identified on Exhibit A providing the highest quote for such Vehicle is hereby approved, upon and subject to the above terms and conditions, and such other terms and conditions that the

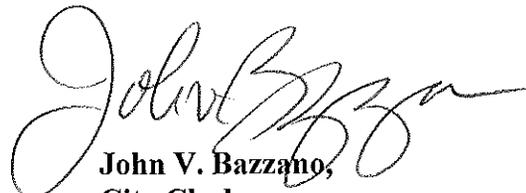
Purchasing Agent and the Corporation Counsel shall deem appropriate and in the best interests of the City; and be it further

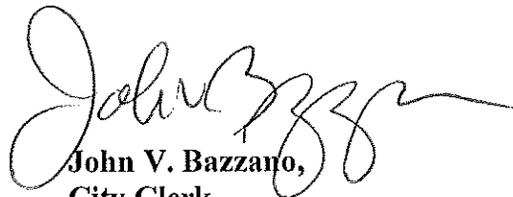

**Whereas,** The State Department of Social Services has set aside funds for the City to use in operating an Early Care and Education Program consisting of eight Early Learning Centers; and

**Whereas,** The State Department of Education offers funding for the reimbursement of early care and education food costs through the Child and Adult Care Food Program; and

**Whereas,** The DFCYR will continue to administer approximately 2,000 early childhood education slots in the City, work on the six Building Blocks of the Blueprint for Young Children, and provide coordination and leadership to all programs effecting children ages 0-8; now, therefore, be it

**Resolved,** That the Mayor, or his designee, on behalf of the City is hereby authorized to apply for and accept State of Connecticut early childhood funds, and other related funds and grants, for Fiscal Years 2012 – 2016 for the administration of early childhood programs, and enter into appropriate one or multi-year contracts or agreements for the provision of such funds and related grants as well as the services to be paid for with such funds and grants, pursuant to terms acceptable to the Mayor and Corporation Counsel; and be it further

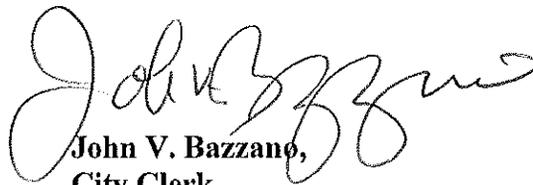

This is to certify that at a meeting of the Court of Common Council, June 13, 2011, the following RESOLUTION was passed.

**Whereas,** The City of Hartford ("City") is the owner of a certain parcel of real property known as 547 Park Street, Hartford, Connecticut (the "Property"), and

**Whereas,** The City has granted the Hartford WIC Program ("Program"), a grant funded program of the City's Health Department, the use and occupancy of the City owned building located at 547 Park Street along with a parking lot adjacent to the building; and

**Whereas,** The acquisition of additional parking spaces would greatly facilitate the operation of the Program; and

**Whereas,** Segundo Roche is the owner of a vacant lot located immediately adjacent to the Property at 539 Park Street; and

**Whereas,** Mr. Roche is willing to lease to the City fifteen (15) parking spaces on his property at the rate of Six Hundred and 00/100 (\$600.00) Dollars per month; and

**Whereas,** Mr. Roche owes past due real estate taxes on his property and has agreed to have the City apply the full amount of the rental payment, which would otherwise be received from the City, toward his outstanding balances until such time as his accounts are paid in full; and

**Whereas,** The parties are willing to enter into a license agreement subject to the following terms and conditions:

Initial term of the lease is for one (1) year, commencing on May 1, 2011 and ending on April 30, 2012, with two (2) options to renew for one (1) year each.

The total monthly payment to be paid by the City for the fifteen (15) spaces shall be Six Hundred Dollars and 00/100 (\$600.00). Said amount shall be applied toward the outstanding amounts owed to the City by Segundo Roche.
