**WHEREAS**, The program allows participants in the WIC program (women, infants, and children) who are identified as "nutritionally at risk" to buy fresh fruits and vegetables at FMNP authorized farmers' markets, and

**WHEREAS**, Eligible recipients receive five checks for \$3.00 each during the market season through WIC offices statewide, and

**WHEREAS**, In Hartford, the program is administered by the City's Department of Health & Human Services' WIC Program, and

**WHEREAS**, The CT Department of Agriculture will reimburse the City of Hartford for the costs of accounting, check issuance, and distribution of information to eligible participants and has advised the City that \$3,400 will be provided to the City for this purpose, now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, That the Court of Common Council hereby authorizes the City of Hartford to apply for and accept \$3,400 from the CT Department of Agriculture to support the WIC Farmer's Market Nutrition Program, and be it further

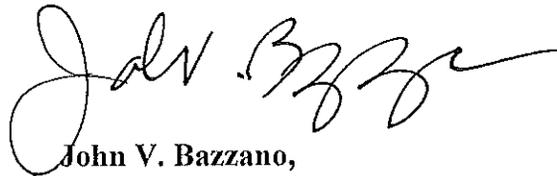

**WHEREAS,** The Year Three Annual Plan was developed according to the City's HUD-approved Citizen Participation Plan, which included two public hearings, several community meetings and a 30-day comment period that solicited citizen feedback on the needs of the community in areas such as Housing, Economic Development, and Public Services; and

**WHEREAS,** The priorities of the City's Plan of Conservation and Development were incorporated into the development of this plan in the context of creating suitable living environment, decent housing, and economic opportunity for our low and moderate-income residents; and

**RESOLVED,** That the Court of Common Council authorizes the Mayor to submit the Year Three Annual Action Plan to HUD for approval and release of funds; and be it further

**RESOLVED,** That the Mayor or his designee is hereby authorized to execute any and all manner of other documents and to take such other actions as he and the Corporation Counsel may deem appropriate and in the best interests of the City in order to effectuate the above transaction; and be it further

**WHEREAS**, The following is the total outstanding tax liability and years of levy in accordance with the above mentioned Collector's file, as set forth in the certification:

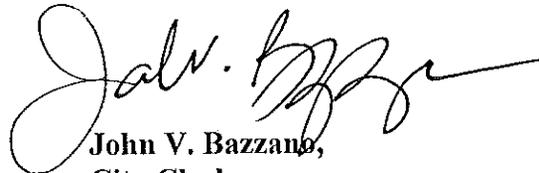

This is to certify that at a meeting of the Court of Common Council, June 25, 2012, the following RESOLUTION was passed.

**WHEREAS,** The City of Hartford (City), operating as a Public Housing Agency (PHA), has administered a Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher, Homeownership and Moderate Rehabilitation (Section 8) Program funded by the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) since 1976, and

**WHEREAS,** The Section 8 Program benefits eligible Hartford residents by subsidizing rents and thereby creating affordable housing, and

**WHEREAS,** The City recently issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the operation of the Section 8 Program and Imagineers LLC, a Hartford based firm since 1974, responded to the RFP, and

**WHEREAS,** Imagineers has extensive experience operating Section 8 programs in seven municipalities in the State, including a 37 year history in Hartford, and has been rated by HUD as "High-Performing" for the past twelve years, and

**WHEREAS,** It is in the best interest of the City to continue to contract with Imagineers LLC for the administration of Hartford's Section 8 Program, now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED,** That the Mayor is authorized to enter into a contract with Imagineers LLC for the operation of the City's Section 8 Program for a term of five (5) years, beginning on July 1, 2012, with an option for two 1-year extensions, and be it further

**RESOLVED,** That the contract will include a provision that the City will receive a 9.0% administrative fee, and be it further

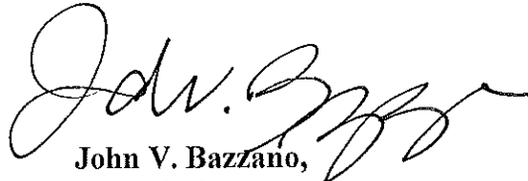
