This is to certify that at a meeting of the Court of Common Council, September 26, 2011, the following RESOLUTION was passed.

**Whereas,** The Connecticut Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services (DMHAS) provides grant funds to municipalities for the purpose of facilitating the development of alcohol, tobacco, and other drug abuse prevention initiatives at the local level with the support of chief elected officials, and

**Whereas,** As a condition of receipt of this funding municipalities must create Local Prevention Councils (LPCs) to oversee prevention initiatives, and

**Whereas,** The goals of an LPC are to increase awareness of alcohol, tobacco and other drug abuse prevention and to stimulate the development and implementation of local prevention activities primarily focused on youth, and

**Whereas,** Hartford's Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse has been serving as the City's Local Prevention Council and the City has received LPC grant funds for the past seventeen (17) years and has contracted with local service providers to provide prevention services, and

**Whereas,** DMHAS has notified the City of Hartford that an LPC grant of \$7,130 will be made available for the period July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012, now, therefore, be it

**Resolved,** That the City of Hartford is authorized to apply for and receive a grant of \$7,130 from the State of Connecticut Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services through its Local Prevention Council program, and be it further

**Resolved,** That the Hartford Commission on Alcohol and Drug Abuse is designated as Hartford's Local Prevention Council for purposes of this grant, and

**Resolved,** That the Mayor is authorized to execute any and all manner of other documents and to take such other actions as he and the Corporation Counsel may deem

appropriate and in the best interests of the City in order to receive, contract and expend the above referenced grant funds, and be it further

**Resolved,** That no person or entity shall be entitled to rely on, or otherwise claim any benefit by reason of this resolution should the Mayor fail to execute the aforementioned agreement or other documents, or to take any of the aforesaid actions, and be it further

**Resolved,** That all approvals and authorizations provided hereby are contingent upon, and only shall be effective on and by means of, the parties executing such documents, and taking such actions, all of which shall be, in form and substance, acceptable to the Mayor and the Corporation Counsel.

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

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
**Whereas**, In 2006, property owners Downtown and Asylum Hill passed a referendum to establish the Hartford Business Improvement District and

This is to certify that at a meeting of the Court of Common Council, September 26, 2011, the following RESOLUTION was passed as amended.

**Whereas**, The Upper Albany Neighborhood Collaborative, UANC, is a 501c(3) organization that has been operating in Hartford since 1990, maintaining a central "presence" in the community at their offices in the Collin Bennett Building at 1229 Albany Avenue; and,

**Whereas**, The UANC benefits the community by providing a variety of services, responding creatively to the unmet needs of the community with adaptive and responsive programming; and,


**Whereas**, The UANC currently provides the following five specific programs:

- Volunteer Income Tax assistance – providing tax preparation assistance to over 700 residents. The program operates annually January through April 15.
- Volunteer opportunities at their concession stands at various entertainment and sporting events, for residents and college students home for the summer.
- A Seniors Computer Literacy program.
- Participation in the "seed" component of the Weed and Seed program.
- Approximately six social and community-building events year-round, including the *National Night Out*; and

**Whereas**, Additionally, UANC hosts annual holiday programs providing foodstuff at Thanksgiving and Christmas for 100 - 400 families, a back to school backpack and school supplies program and computers for job searches for adults; now therefore be it

**Resolved**, That the Court of Common Council does hereby designate \$10,500 from the Fiscal Year 2011-2012 City Contributions Towards Public Programs account to Upper Albany Neighborhood Collaborative.
