FOCUS ON COMPOST AND COMMUNITY GARDENS

Beginning Tuesday, May 3rd, and until supplies last, Hartford residents will be able to pick-up compost at Hartford’s Bulky Waste and Recycling Center. It is located at 280 Liebert Road (near the old landfill) and open Tuesday – Saturday from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Please bring your own container and Hartford ID. 50 gallon limit per day.

Hartford residents are first asked to register for a free “Green Permit” at the City Yard (40 Jennings Road) --- Monday-Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 12 Noon and Saturday 8:00 a.m. to Noon (but at 280 Liebert Road).

Please see the attached brochure (in English and in Spanish) for a list of acceptable recyclable items.

Last fall’s leaf collection in the City of Hartford has resulted in hundreds of cubic yards of compost back-haul for use by Hartford residents and community gardeners. The goal is to promote urban agriculture and the value and benefits of eating fresh, healthy and locally grown foods from the Capital City’s Community Gardens.

This project is a collaboration of the Mayor’s Office, the Department of Public Works, GreenCycle and Knox Parks.
