CITY SNOW REMOVAL PLAN UPDATE

---NEWS ADVISORY FOR TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 8---

Hartford Mayor Pedro Segarra announced that efforts to remove snow and ice from the roofs of city-owned buildings will continue in earnest on Tuesday, February 8th. Contracted crews will focus on Pope Park Community Center, which also serves as an emergency shelter. City forces will concentrate on 40 Jennings Road. Fire House roofs should be cleared by the end of the day tomorrow. Parker Memorial Community Center will reopen on Tuesday.

“We must ensure the public’s safety both in our city-owned buildings and on our streets. 15 seasonal workers will begin duties on Wednesday; this is in addition to the 15 Hartford residents who started today. Mother Nature cooperated with us today and we made progress, but there is more work to be done, especially since another storm is approaching,” said Mayor Segarra.

Regarding tonight’s storm, DPW crews will begin pre-treating the roads at 11:00 p.m. this evening. Timing and accumulation will determine the plowing schedule. Snow loading crews will also be working overnight along Trumbull Street in Downtown Hartford. On Tuesday, these crews will move north to Seyms Street in the Clay Arsenal neighborhood.

On Tuesday, the snow blower is scheduled to be deployed along side streets between Franklin and Wethersfield Avenues in the South End. Please note that on-street parking will be restricted. Also on Tuesday, the “snow dragon” is scheduled to be in the Colt Park area.
