## **SNOW REMOVAL PROCEDURES CONTINUE PLAN OF ACTION FOR WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 9<sup>TH</sup>**

The City of Hartford continues its snow removal efforts regarding city-owned properties and streets to ensure public safety.

The Main Branch of the Hartford Public Library will be closed on Wednesday so that snow and ice can be removed from the roof. Arch Street, between Prospect and Main, will be closed starting at 6:00 a.m. City employee parking behind the library will be detoured to the Sheldon Street Parking Lot.

Pope Park Community Center will be open tomorrow now that crews have completed their roof work. The facility is available tonight as a shelter in case of an emergency.

“A lot of hard work and muscle has gone into clearing the roofs of our city-owned buildings. As I have said, and will continue to say, there is no greater priority to me and my administration than ensuring the safety of our residents, especially our children,” said Mayor Pedro E. Segarra.

Road work continues in earnest on Wednesday. The snow blower is scheduled to work in the Blue Hills neighborhood and the “snow dragon” will once again be in the Colt Park area before it goes to New Haven at the end of the day.

DPW crews will concentrate on the streets in the Parkville neighborhood; Asylum Hill---prioritizing the streets near Saint Francis Hospital and Medical Center; and Frog Hollow. Restricted parking will be posted and enforced.

Property owners are once again urged to shovel the snow from walkways, driveways, and sidewalks. Please clear away snow from fire hydrants and do not shovel snow back into the streets.
