CITY ENCOURAGES PHONE BOOK RECYCLING

(March 15, 2012) --- The City of Hartford Department of Public Works is encouraging residents to recycle their phone books.

Phone books can be recycled by placing them in the property's curbside recycling containers. In addition, from Friday, March 16 to Friday, May 4, 2012, phone books can be brought to the following drop-off locations:

- Hartford Bulky Waste Recycling Center, 180 Liebert Road: (Open Tuesdays through Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.) A free Green Permit is required for all residents and businesses, and can be obtained at 525 Main Street, 2nd floor.
- Knox Parks Foundation Hartford Environmental Office, 75 Laurel Street: (Open 24 hours a day, seven days a week) Phone book recycling containers are located at the rear gate, which can be accessed from Laurel Street. For more information, call 860-951-7694.
